GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

The event is to be run under EA rules insofar as they are applicable to this event and shall include any other rules formulated by the organising committee. We strongly recommend that all competitors obtain a copy of the relevant EA Rules through the EV website vic.equestrian.org.au

Duty of Care and Risk Management: The National Equestrian Centre and Equestrian Victoria have a Duty of Care and Risk Management Policy which are available on the EV and WPNEC websites.

Member and Child Protection Policy: EA Member Protection Policy and Child Protection Policy and other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EA rules are available on the EA website.

Codes of Conduct for EA Conducted Equestrian Events: Codes of Conduct for competitors, spectators and volunteers as well as other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EA rules are available at the EA website.

Riders Age: The minimum age for entrants is 30 years the day before the first day of competition (28^{th} February 2020). Age brackets for this event are as follows: * 30 - 39 years * 40 + 49 years *

Entries: 2020 entries will be by completed via nominate.

Breast Cancer Network Australia (BCNA): \$1.00 from every class entry will be donated to BNCA.

Close of Entries: Entries Extended Close WEDNESDAY 05th FEBRUARY 2020. No late entries will be accepted. If entries are incorrectly filled out, your entry will be returned with a \$20 administration fee. Any class changes will incur a \$20 administration fee.

Scratching's/Refund Policy: Full refund less \$30 admin fee if scratched before entries close on 05/02/2020 (5:00pm).

From 06/02/2020 to 28/02/2020 (5:00pm) refund 50% of entries will be refunded only with original vet certificate or medical certificate (supplied within 48hrs) less \$30 admin fee.

After commencement of competition 29/02/2020 (7:00am) there will be no refunds.

Scratching's will only be accepted via email jumping@equestrianvictoria.com.au. No scratching's will be accepted over the phone.

Helmets: All helmets must satisfy the new Australian Safety Standards and must be worn at all times whilst mounted. Combined Training Riders will need to have their helmets tagged before competing. Helmet tagging will be available on Saturday.

Membership: Riders must be current members of EA or HRCAV at the time of competition.

Horses: All horses and ponies must be four (4) years of age or over at the time of nomination.

Rider Number: Each horse must wear a bridle or saddle number on each side or a chest number. This must be worn at all times. Competitors are to provide their own rider numbers, identification numbers will be allocated on the draw.

Gear Check: There will be no gear check points. The onus is on the rider to ensure compliance with discipline rules found on the website. Judges have the right to eliminate a rider if they compete in the incorrect gear.

Objections and Disputes: Objections must be made in writing to the organising committee within thirty (30) minutes of completion of the class giving rise to the objection. A formal protest requires a deposit of \$100.00 that will be forfeited unless the objection is upheld. All objections must be made through the OC. The decision of the OC will be final and no other discussions will be entered into.

Volunteers and Helpers: All competitors are required to provide a volunteer for a couple of hours during the event. The running of equestrian events relies heavily on volunteers. Abuse by a rider or associated person that is aimed at any volunteer or official, staff member (EV and WPNEC) at an EV event will not be tolerated. Incidents of this nature will result in immediate elimination of the rider. Many of our helpers are experienced; others are not. Be sure to ask for assistance if you are unsure of what to do. To keep the event on time, it is crucial for helpers to report to the volunteer coordinator 15 minutes before their scheduled duty begins. We would be grateful if you could please advise whether any helper or volunteer is a Veterinarian, Doctor, Farrier etc. If you are unable to provide a volunteer, an additional fee of \$20 will be added to your entry fee.

HRCAV Riders Conditions: HRCAV is pleased to ratify HRCAV member involvement at the Masters Games.

- HRCAV members will be covered by HRCAV insurance when competing in the disciplines of Dressage, Show Horse, Jumping and Combined Training.
- HRCAV members are **not** covered by insurance if jumping higher than their assessed level for Jumping or Combined Training. For Insurance purposes, all events involving jumping: HRCAV members must jump at their assessed level or lower. This will be checked upon receiving your entry.
- HRCAV Members are permitted to wear their club uniform to this event.
- HRCAV members are not covered for carriage driving or other harness activities.



GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

Facility Fee: A WPNEC facility fee of \$16.00 per day/per horse is payable at the time of entry.

Stables and Yards: All stabling must be booked directly through wpnec.com. au. Email admin@wpnec.com.au or phone 03 9741 7672.

Feed and Bedding: Horse feed and bedding can be booked directly through WPNEC and is the responsibility of the competitor. See wpnec.com.au for details.

Hot Weather Policy: Horses exercising and competing in hot environmental conditions can be affected by heat stress. When environmental heat conditions are adverse, exercising horses require appropriate cooling measures to safeguard their welfare. The primary responsibility for the welfare of horses competing and exercising during hot weather lies with the rider of the horse. Riders must always take action to prevent, manage and treat heat stress in their horses. Event organisers are responsible for providing adequate facilities and information that riders need to safeguard the welfare of horses. Access to ice and cooling water during competition is a compulsory requirement that arises under certain environmental conditions.

Horse Welfare: The welfare of the horse is paramount. Instances of cruelty or mistreatment will be reported to the organising committee. Unsoundness – Judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have the authority to stop an unsound horse during competition. At other times a horse that is stopped or reported by an official who considers it to be unsound must attend the Veterinary Surgeon before continuing on in competition. Medication Control – Any competitor requested by an official from the Organising Committee to attend for sample testing must present to the Official Veterinary Surgeon as directed.

Dogs: Dogs must be under effective control at all times and are not allowed in marshalling or competition areas including any part of the indoor arenas. All dogs must be on a leash at all times.

Image Consent: By entering this event you give your consent to EV to copy or reproduce images of yourself as EV may determine, without acknowledgement of yourself and without your entitlement to any remuneration or compensation now or in the future. The images may be used by EV in multimedia productions, publications, brochures and on the website or social media to promote a range of initiatives for EV. EV agrees not to use any image that may be deemed adverse, or defamatory to the person entering this event.

Liability: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted will undertake to indemnify the Organising Body against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Organising Body by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any rider, trainer or attendant whilst attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agrees that act or omission on the part of such rider or attendant found in any action against the Organising Body to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity.

Swabbing: The OC reserves the right to undertake the swabbing of any horse at its discretion.

Presentations: All presentations will be unmounted and will take place on the grassed presentation area facing indoor arena 1. (With the exception of Show Horse & Hunter Classes).

Best Performed Off The Track: All horses eligible for off the track need to nominate at time of entry. Horses eligible must be racehorses that are thoroughbred, bred to race, that have been Stud Book registered either in Australia with the Australian Stud Book, or internationally.

Off The Track Prize Money for the Disciplines Off The Track Winners will only be awarded where there is a minimum of 4 Off The Track Competitors in the Discipline.

Most Versatile Off The Track: All horses eligible for the most versatile Off The Track need to nominate at time of entry. Horses eligible must be racehorses that are thoroughbred, bred to race, that have been Stud Book registered either in Australia with the Australian Stud Book, or internationally. **To be eligible horses must compete in a minimum of three disciplines.**

Scoring: The most versatile Off The Track Thoroughbred will go to the horse that has accumulated the most Off The Track points throughout the weekend. Points will be awarded on a sliding scale per Championships placings per class for Dressage, Combined Training and Jumping. Showing points will be awarded 3 points for 1st, 2 points for 2nd, and 1 point for 3rd for each class.

PLEASE NOTE:

★ Championship rugs will only be awarded where there is a minimum of 6 competitors. ★ Ribbons and medallions will still be presented. ★ The OC reserves the right to cancel any class due to insufficient numbers. ★
